

Surveys:

International Talent Monitor: A biennial survey by Barcelona Global aimed at understanding the needs of international professionals that live and work in Barcelona

Perception Survey: Anual survey where our International Council members tell us how they perceive the city in terms of business-friendliness, talent, quality of life and brand, and help us to understand the image Barcelona conveys to the rest of the world.

Scale-up Monitor: A biennial survey on the scale-up ecosystem of the city to identify its strengths and weaknesses and to kick-off specific actions to make it one of the top locations in the world to start and grow a company.

NTT City Talent Index, that combines 64 major quantitative indicators associated with a city's talent and compares Barcelona's scores with those of 25 top European cities to know where the city really stands.

Barcelona in the Rankings: A tool that allow users to check and analyze the presence of Barcelona in different global rankings developed by prestigious consultants and key international organizations.

Taxation for Talent and Enterpreneurship®

Barcelona Global, with a team of 15 top law firms, benchmarked the Spanish tax system on talent attraction and entrepreneurship (investors, entrepreneurs and employees) against 13 competing economies, and subsequently developed a set of proposals for amelioration. Through our work with governments and political parties to encourage their implementation, we have so far achieved the inclusion of substantial enhancements in the regulation. Nevertheless, there's still way for improvement and we continue working towards a neutral tax environment that will allow entrepreneurship and talent to thrive in Barcelona.

Streamlining of formalities for International Talent®

The Barcelona Global International Talent Monitor has repeatedly identified red-tape as one of the main issues for international professionals that relocate to Barcelona to work. Barcelona Global has mapped those formalities and set up conversations with the different levels of the public administration to make their landing process easier. Notable outcomes have been achieved, such as the creation by the City Council of a website collecting all the information about procedures and the opening of Barcelona International Welcome Desk to provide online and face to face assistance. Also, improvements in the formalities are being included in the Spanish regulation and we continue working with the central government to streamline the process related to the obtention of the residence permit.

Barcelona global hub

Higher Education®

It is estimated that in 2030, more than 10.2 million people will travel abroad to study for a bachelor's or master's degree. Barcelona Global believes that Barcelona should play a key role in the higher education sector, which is so important for economic development and attracting talent. To do so, it must remove regulatory obstacles, improve the city's brand positioning as an educational center, and take steps to internationalize the university system. These steps include: (1) attracting universities from other countries to set up a campus in Barcelona; (2) creating an international liberal arts campus in Barcelona; (3) boosting professional STEM education at the highest level; (4) creating institutionalized research collaborations amongst our best research centers and international leaders; and (5) creating a campus for the "European" Universities" initiative.

Barcelona Global ongoing projects

1. Talent atraction, retention and creation

Affordable and accessible international school

The companies and research centres in Barcelona successfully attract junior talent, but they struggle to hire professionals for middle management or senior researcher positions, often with young families. One of the main reasons they state is the unsuitability of the existing network of international schools in Barcelona to their needs. Despite them being fantastic in terms of quality, they are concentrated in areas of the city that are difficult to access by public transport and that would require long commuting times from where these professionals usually live, and the fees make them unaffordable for their level of salaries. Barcelona Global is developing a project to find solutions that can lower this barrier and therefore increase the city's attractiveness for middle management talent, which has a very big impact in the ability of the city's companies and research centres to compete internationally.

Barcelona MBA Day

There are more than 600 international students studying global MBAs in Barcelona. Barcelona Global works with top managers to enable these students to make small group visits to the main companies, research centers, and cultural institutions.

The UPC/UPF Interuniversity Degree in Industrial Technologies and Economic Analysis, which is the first degree promoted by the foundation and has been running since 2018, has highly demanding entry requirements.

2. Improved and Sustainable Infrastructures and Urban Development

Barcelona Global helps research centers and academic institutions to attract researchers by helping their life partners to find jobs. Through its business partners and companies, Barcelona provides specialized coaches and mentors to help researchers' partners to establish links with the economic and social fabric of the city.

Affordable and accessible housing

Proposal agreed by 50 experts setting out specific measures to create a housing policy for the entire metropolitan area. The aim is to continue to provide social housing for rent and significantly increase the stock of affordable housing, with public backing and private investment.

Sustainable mobility in the metropolitan area

Barcelona Global developed, in 2020 with a working group of 60 experts, a workstream to promote sustainable and efficient mobility in Barcelona and its region, resulting in a report with 9 big areas of general consensus and 15 key proposals. As the city overcomes the situation generated by the pandemic, the working group is re-assessing and updating the proposals for the benefit of any stakeholder designing city strategies in the coming years.

3. Support for Key Sectors

Objectiu Barcelona

Barcelona will shortly start a new electoral campaign to choose, in May 2023, the new team that will lead the city. Barcelona Global starts a process of reflection with proposals to design a roadmap for boosting the economy, improving urban quality and regaining the city's pride.

Barcelona and tourism

10 workstreams, with the participation of more than 30 key tourism stakeholders in the city, to regain quality, sustainable and competitive tourism that can become a driving force behind the talent economy. The report -the third about tourism published by Barcelona Global in the last 4 years, intends to be a working base and seeks to identify the measures to be undertaken in the coming months, both by the different administrations and public operators and as well as by the private sector and the civil society, so that the tourism industry, key for the economy of Barcelona, emerges stronger from the most important crisis that an economic sector ever suffered in such a short period of time in the city.




